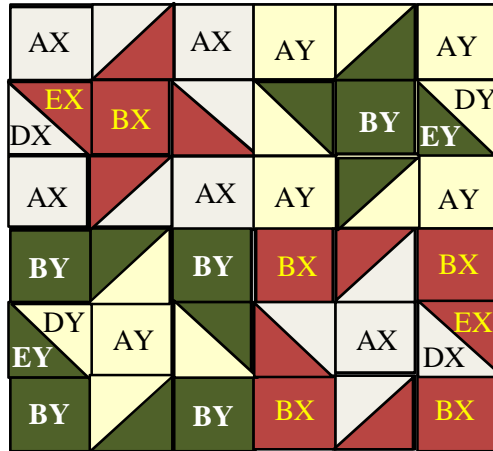


# MAY 2019 Four Wheels Turnin'



A very traditional block.

## WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

A dark and light print of one color "X" (HERE, the X colors are beige and red)

A dark and light print of a complimentary color "Y" (Here Ys are yellow and green)  
color "Y"

### FROM THE "X" COLOR:

- 5 2-1/2" squares (A) of the **lighter** shade of "X"
- 5 2-1/2" squares (B) of the **darker** shade of "X"
- 4 2-7/8" squares (D) of the **lighter** shade of "X"
- 4 2-7/8" squares (E) of the **darker** shade of "X"

### FROM THE "Y" COLOR:

- 5 2-1/2" squares (A) of the **lighter** shade of "Y"
- 5 2-1/2" squares (B) of the **darker** shade of "Y"
- 4 2-7/8" squares (D) of the **lighter** shade of "Y"
- 4 2-7/8" squares (E) of the **darker** shade of "Y"

## CONSTRUCTION

Lay your colors out and label them as AX, BX, AY, and BY colors.

Place each D and E square of the "X" color together with right sides facing. Draw a diagonal line on each set. Sew a 1/4" seam on each side of each diagonal line. Cut along each diagonal line to form 8 2-1/2" half-square triangles (HSTs).

Press the triangles being careful not to stretch them.

Do the same with the "Y" color D and E squares.

Arrange the 2-1/2" squares and the 2-1/2" HSTs into the block configuration as in the diagram above. Construct each individual star first. Then sew the four together. Be sure of your accurate seam allowances. Press as you go along.

Be sure to starch and press the finished **12-1/2"** block after complete construction.
